Originally issued in wrappers (not present here), this small volume was 'Published for the benefit of the Famine Relief Fund of the Highlands of Scotland'.

'Lang occupied a run at Terrinallum, near Mortlake in Victoria, between 1839 and 1845. He was a gifted amateur artist, as these plates show. The original sketch, dated 1845, from which the first plate was drawn is held in an Australian private collection. Lang himself appears in it, sitting before the cabin fire at night Lang also appears in the second plate where he is seen sitting at a camp fire with a companion and a native boy. Lang's book of views is quite uncommon and a most attractive work. Running neck and neck with Prout's six small lithographs, the Scenes in the Bush of Australia is one of the first two Victorian illustrated books; in its hand-coloured form it has a clear field as the first Victorian coloured plate book' (Wantrup). \$25,000













The original muster roll of A Company, 124th Regiment, Illinois Infantry

This Unionist unit was raised in Kewanee, Henry County. Each opening of the roll contains printed columns, with the particulars of enlistees added in ink in at least two hands. The details of 19 officers and NCOs and 80 privates are provided, apparently in the hand of Captain R.A. Tenney, all but one with their date of enlistment given as 9 August 1862. A further 25 soldiers, with enlistment dates from 1864 and 1865, have been added later in another hand, presumably his successor Captain Edmond C. Raymond.

The only black enlistees, four 'under-cooks', are entered separately at the foot of the final opening. All four are described as residents of Vicksburg, Mississippi, and all enlisted soon after this important Confederate stronghold fell to Union forces on 4 July 1863, suggesting that they were likely freed slaves.

The 'Remarks' column makes grim reading: almost all of the detailed entries commence with the words 'Deserted', 'Discharged' (almost invariably with a disability), 'Died' (invariably of wounds or sickness), or 'Killed' (by shell or musket ball). \$9900



The detailed register of approximately 60 hotels owned or leased by the Lion Brewing and Malting Company Limited, Jerningham Street, North Adelaide, compiled between the 1880s and 1920s.

This unique register gathers together in one volume a wealth of detail pertaining to the hotels in question, which Lion operated under a 'tied house' system. Lessees of these premises could stock only the products of the brewer owner, a lucrative practice since outlawed.




